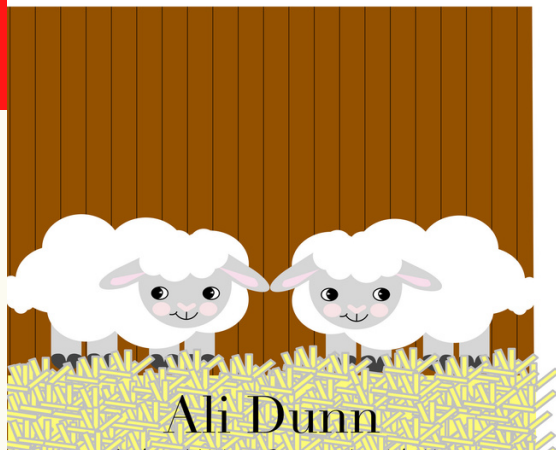

Story Time Lesson



Learning Objectives

Understand the concept of same vs different
Discuss what makes each person special
Recognize uniqueness in ourselves, and celebrate it



Vocabulary

Duplicate- exactly like something else

Unique- being the only one of its kind

Individual- being distinct from a group



Discussion

How in our class/ home are we the same and different?

What makes each of us special?

What do you think is the message of the story?



Activities

Read One of Two, find key vocabulary words in book

Compare and Contrast- gather familiar classroom/ household items. Discuss how items are similar, and explain how items are different.

Make Fingerprint Sheep- see attached instructions

Story Time Activity

Finger Print Sheep

Make your own Finger Print Sheep
inspired by the children's book, One of Two



Materials:



white pencil



scissors



white finger paint



colored paper

Sheep Outline



sheep printable

Step One

Print sheep outline on heavy paper. Cut out sheep parts.



Step Two

Glue parts to colored construction paper



Step Three

Dip fingertips into white paint to create the fleece body of the sheep



Finally

Discuss how each person has a unique fingerprint, even twins
